## LETS GET THESE TRADES RIGHT

Once more NO SPB LEAGUE player trade is considered OFFICIAL until all of the following events occur. Each manager MUST:

- o Have paid his league dues for the upcoming season.
- o Must submit IN WRITING the details of the trade.
- o Must submit IN WRITING a list of players to be waived.

No manager has fulfilled all of these conditions as of this date, therefore any trade already reported to the league office in considered unofficial.

## SPBI-55 WAIVER LISTS

The SPBI-55 Waiver list for each team is due at the league office NO LATER than February 28, 1994. On the accompanying form each manager is to list, in order of preference, the first 20 players on his 32 man roster. Depending on his teams final record, the first 18, 19, or 20 players will be protected. The remaining players will be considered waived and join the pool of rookies to be drafted for the 1956 season. If you have any questions on this procedure please consult the league constitution or contact your league president. In the event a teams waiver list is not received by the due date, the league president will determine that teams protected and waived player list.

IT'S PIERCE VS. SCORE IN SPBL ALL-STAR GAME

BROOKLYN - Billy Pierce of the Lafayette Blue Sox, the hottest pitcher in the Seasons Past Baseball League with a 12-2 record and a microscopic ERA (0.98) will oppose Herb Score (12-5, 3.39 ERA) of the Evanston Black Sox in the league's All-Star Game this afternoon at Ebbets Field.

Pierce leads a dominant Harridge Division pitching staff featuring 15-game winner Warren Spahn and Billy Hoelt (13-2, 2.58) of the division-leading Schaumburg Saxons and Don Newcombe (13-4, 2.44) of the Pacific Cascades.

Pierce and Score were named starting pitchers by Commissioner Jim Wheeler in the wee hours this morning, following his release on bail after a brawl among league officials resulted in the arrest of a dozen people at the Waldorf Hotel.

Wheeler, commenting briefly on the incident, said, "It was just a little misunderstanding that got out of hand, but I can assure you all of the owners were sober, I swear."

SPBL managers voted eight members of the first-place Frankfort Tigers to the Giles roster. Four teams - the Saxons, Cascades, Quartz Hill Wind, Rossville Cubs - each placed five players on the Harridge squad.

The ceremonial first pitch will be thrown out by former baseball commissioner William D. (Spike) Eckert. He is a last-minute replacement for another former baseball commissioner, A.B. (Happy) Chandler, who was hospitalized following last night's incident at the Waldorf.
